## Advocating for Amendment 3: Legalizing Recreational Marijuana in Florida

**Tallahassee, FL** – With the November ballot approaching, proponents of Amendment 3 are gearing up for a significant push to legalize recreational marijuana in Florida. This amendment aims to allow adults over the age of 21 to purchase, possess, and consume limited amounts of marijuana, positioning cannabis regulation on par with alcohol.

### A History of Advocacy

### The Case for Amendment 3

The proposed amendment promises to bring numerous benefits, including the creation of tens of thousands of jobs, the generation of hundreds of millions of dollars in state revenue, and a reduction in taxpayer costs associated with prosecuting minor possession offenses.

### Key Motivations

Two primary motivations drive support for Amendment 3:

**Youth Safety:** A study by the American Medical Association found a decrease in teen marijuana use in states that legalized recreational marijuana, dispelling fears that legalization would increase youth consumption.

**Public Health:** Dangerous chemicals in illegal marijuana pose a significant health risk. State Rep. Ralph Massullo highlighted that a substantial portion of marijuana confiscated by law enforcement contains harmful additives like fentanyl, meth, and illegal herbicides. Legalizing and regulating marijuana would ensure that consumers have access to safe, tested products.

### Ensuring Safety and Compliance

Proponents argue that, like medical marijuana, recreational cannabis should be subject to rigorous testing to ensure purity and safety. Lawmakers would need to implement restrictions similar to those for tobacco, such

as prohibiting smoking in public places, near schools, and in indoor public spaces.

## **Overcoming Opposition**

Despite expected opposition and misinformation campaigns, supporters of Amendment 3 remain confident. Past experiences have shown that voters can see through the rhetoric. In previous campaigns, over 70% of voters dismissed the false claims made by opponents, a trend advocates hope will continue.

As November approaches, the focus is on mobilizing support and educating the public about the benefits of Amendment 3. Advocates urge Floridians to stand up for common-sense laws, public safety, and personal freedom by supporting the amendment.
