

FDA Raises Concerns About Infused Chocolate Bars, Linking Them to Seizures

The FDA has issued a warning against consuming Diamond Shroomz chocolate bars, citing reports of illness and hospitalization linked to the product.

Reported Symptoms and Concerns

Eight people reported illness, with six hospitalized after consuming the bars infused with hemp-derived CBD and delta-8. Symptoms included seizures, CNS depression, agitation, abnormal heart rates, nausea, and vomiting.

Product Details and Market Presence

Diamond Shroomz bars are marketed as containing nootropic ingredients, with one variant, the Birthday Cake flavor, claiming to offer an “energetic, chillaxed, and euphoric” experience. Despite assurances of safety, the FDA advises against their consumption due to potential health risks.

FDA’s Response and Previous Actions

This warning aligns with the FDA’s recent crackdown on cannabis-infused products appealing to children. The agency highlights concerns about the potential appeal to minors and urges caution regarding the consumption of such products.

Consumers are advised to avoid Diamond Shroomz chocolate bars and to remain vigilant about the risks associated with cannabis-infused edibles, particularly those with appealing packaging or marketing strategies.
