

From Policy to Profit: Pennsylvania's Journey into Adult-Use Cannabis

A recent analysis by FTI Consulting, commissioned by Responsible PA, has highlighted the significant economic potential of legalizing adult-use cannabis in Pennsylvania. The report projects annual sales could reach between \$1.7 billion and \$2.8 billion, generating substantial tax revenues estimated at \$420 million to \$720 million. Additionally, the legalization is expected to create between 26,250 and 44,500 new jobs, predominantly within the burgeoning cannabis sector.

These efforts represent a proactive approach to ensuring that the potential legalization of cannabis is handled with a focus on fairness and economic benefit for all Pennsylvanians.
