

# State Fair Breaks Ground with Legal Cannabis Sales

## California State Fair Becomes First to Legally Sell Cannabis

**Sacramento, CA** – Making history over the weekend, the California State Fair has become the first state-sanctioned fair in the United States to legally sell and allow the consumption of cannabis.
