

Secret Shoppers Among New Rules for Oklahoma Cannabis Industry

Oklahoma Medical Marijuana Authority Implements New Rules for Dispensaries, Grows, and Labs

The Oklahoma Medical Marijuana Authority (OMMA) has introduced new and updated regulations for dispensaries, growers, and labs within the state's medical marijuana industry. These changes, which took effect earlier this week, aim to enhance oversight, ensure product safety, and improve industry standards. NewsChannel 8 spoke with Chico Sherwood, owner of Best Dispensaries, to discuss the impact of these new rules, including the introduction of secret shoppers to inspect licensed businesses.

Introduction of Secret Shoppers

One of the most notable changes is the implementation of secret shoppers, a measure that Sherwood views positively. "As far as secret shoppers go, I welcome them," Sherwood said. This initiative allows the OMMA to discreetly inspect dispensaries and other marijuana-related businesses, ensuring compliance with state regulations without prior notice. The use of secret shoppers is expected to help maintain high standards across the industry, catching non-compliant practices and ensuring that businesses operate within the legal framework.

Enhanced Laboratory Testing Requirements

The updated rules also introduce more stringent laboratory testing and requirements. This change is designed to ensure that medical marijuana products are accurately tested for potency, purity, and safety, providing consumers with reliable information about what they are purchasing. Sherwood emphasized the importance of these regulations, stating, "For one, we know what's in the bag because whenever they're more stringent on their testing we know that they're true tests. It's a good thing because, you know, it's medicine and you need to know exactly what it is you're taking."

Extension of Moratorium and Employment Regulations

In addition to testing and secret shoppers, the OMMA has extended the existing moratorium on new business licenses until August 2026. This moratorium is intended to control the rapid growth of the industry and ensure that existing businesses are adequately regulated before new entrants are allowed.

Another significant update requires all employees working within the medical marijuana industry to apply for and receive credentials authorizing their employment. This measure aims to standardize the workforce and ensure that all employees are properly vetted and trained.

The new rules also prohibit growers from hiring undocumented immigrants, a regulation intended to ensure legal compliance and labor standards within the industry. Sherwood acknowledged the importance of these rules for maintaining industry integrity, stating, “All of the companies that are left today are really good up-to-standard companies and none of us would want to do anything that’s gonna make us lose our license.”

Public Involvement and Regulatory Oversight

According to the OMMA, these rules are part of a broader regulatory framework that includes public comments, hearings, and reviews by the Oklahoma government. This process allows for stakeholder input and ensures that the regulations are well-rounded and considerate of all aspects of the industry.
