### Strict Regulations on Manufacturing

The state has imposed strict regulations on the production of psilocybin products. Specifically, manufacturers in Colorado are prohibited from using synthetic tryptamines in their products. Additionally, all psilocybin products must undergo rigorous testing for the presence of these synthetic substances before they can be distributed. This measure aims to ensure the safety and purity of the products available to consumers.
