

# Kentucky to Hold First-Ever Medical Cannabis License Lottery

## Kentucky's First Medical Cannabis Licensing Lottery Begins

On Monday, October 28, Kentucky marked a significant milestone as state officials conducted the first-ever lottery to issue medical cannabis business licenses. This lottery will distribute a limited number of cultivation and processing licenses to applicants, marking the initial step toward establishing the state's legal medical cannabis industry. The process is expected to be highly competitive, as the state received an overwhelming number of applications from hopeful entrepreneurs.

Kentucky's medical cannabis program, approved in early 2023, is set to go live by January 1, 2025. The lottery held today will determine which businesses gain an early foothold in this emerging market.

### Licensing Scope and Competition

The lottery system in Kentucky's medical cannabis industry covers two key categories in its initial phase: cannabis cultivation and processing licenses. According to reports, the state received 584 applications for cultivation licenses, though only 16 licenses will be issued. Similarly, 344 businesses applied for processor licenses, but only 10 of these applicants will receive the green light to operate.

Due to this limited availability, applicants face steep odds, especially as the program attracted nearly 5,000 business applications across all license categories, including a staggering 4,076 applications for dispensary licenses. However, dispensary licenses are not part of today's lottery, with a separate lottery anticipated for dispensaries later in the year.

### Live-Streaming the Lottery

In an effort to maintain transparency in the lottery process, the state has opted to live-stream the lottery drawing at 2:00 pm. This allows applicants and the public to observe the process in real time, underscoring the state's commitment to a fair and open selection system.

### The Medical Cannabis Program's Structure

Under Kentucky's medical cannabis legislation, cultivators and processors play distinct roles. According to the program guidelines, cultivators are tasked with "planting, raising, harvesting, trimming, and curing raw plant material." Processors, on the other hand, are responsible for "processing and packaging raw plant material into usable product formats" for patients with qualifying medical conditions.

The emphasis on a structured supply chain ensures that each sector of Kentucky's cannabis industry operates within well-defined parameters, facilitating both quality control and adherence to regulatory standards. This separation of roles also mirrors successful models in other states, which have established rigorous oversight

within their medical cannabis supply chains to protect consumer safety.

## **Testing Laboratories: Leading the Way**

The first medical cannabis business license awarded in Kentucky went to KCA Labs, a Nicholasville-based testing facility. KCA Labs previously specialized in hemp product testing and has now expanded its operations to include medical cannabis, ensuring that Kentucky's cannabis products meet quality and safety standards before reaching patients. The early issuance of a laboratory license highlights the importance of a reliable testing infrastructure, providing a foundation for the industry's development.

Testing laboratories are essential in ensuring that cannabis products are free from contaminants and accurately labeled, especially as patient safety and product efficacy are critical in medical cannabis. By establishing testing facilities early on, Kentucky aims to create a robust quality assurance system, safeguarding patient trust in the nascent medical cannabis industry.

## **Kentucky's Path to Medical Cannabis Legalization**

The path to legalization of medical cannabis in Kentucky has been shaped by ongoing legislative efforts and public support. In April 2023, Governor Andy Beshear announced the state's decision to use a lottery system to distribute medical cannabis licenses. This system was introduced to balance fairness with the high demand for licenses in a controlled industry that prioritizes patient care.

The initial round of licensing will help Kentucky's regulatory agencies gather insights into managing the industry while supporting the state's goal of operational readiness by January 2025. Kentucky's medical cannabis program will focus on providing relief for patients with specific qualifying conditions, as defined by the state's legislation.
