

High Stakes: Police Confiscate \$8M Worth of Cannabis Plants in Niagara Falls

Massive Cannabis Bust in Niagara Falls: Police Seize Plants Valued at \$8 Million

The OPP West Region Emergency Response Team, OPP Urban Search and Rescue, Chemical, Biological, Radioactive, Nuclear, and Explosive Response Team, as well as the OPP-led Provincial Asset Forfeiture Unit and the Niagara Regional Police Service (NRPS), all played integral roles in executing the operation and ensuring its success.
