The current scenario presents a perplexing environment for businesses and law enforcement, where adherence to one set of laws risks violating another.

This ongoing issue in New Mexico serves as a crucial case study for other states and federal policymakers. It underscores the imperative of comprehensive federal legislation to resolve discrepancies between state and federal marijuana laws. Without such reforms, the conflicting legal standards are likely to persist, perpetuating disruption and uncertainty in states that have legalized and regulated cannabis.
