California Task Force Seizes \$53M+ of Illegal Cannabis: A Significant Crackdown

Impressive Enforcement Results

Since its inception, UCETF has achieved notable success in its enforcement efforts. With a total of 236 search warrants executed, the task force has seized a staggering \$371,199,431 in unlicensed cannabis. Additionally, UCETF has eradicated 401,458 illicit cannabis plants and confiscated 139 firearms, further enhancing public safety and security.

Collaborative Approach

UCETF operates through collaboration among various state agencies, each playing a crucial role in bolstering enforcement measures. Participating agencies include the Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control, Department of Cannabis Control, Employment Development Department, Department of Fish and Wildlife, California National Guard Counterdrug Task Force, California Division of Occupational Safety and Health, California State Parks, and Department of Tax and Fee Administration. This collaborative effort underscores the collective commitment to upholding the integrity of California's legal cannabis market.
