

Majority of Americans Express Surprise Over Delay in Nationwide Cannabis Legalization, Poll Reveals

Moreover, there is growing recognition of the need for social equity programs to address historical injustices related to marijuana criminalization. A majority of respondents, including both Democrats and Republicans, support the implementation of such programs.
