

Germany Eyes Cannabis Sales Pilot Program via Regulatory Channels, Report Reveals

Germany's government is taking a significant step forward in the second phase of marijuana legalization by initiating a pilot program for commercial sales. Surprisingly, instead of introducing new legislation, the government plans to implement the pilot program through administrative procedures, a recent press report reveals.

Departure from Legislative Route

Health Minister Karl Lauterbach, a key proponent of cannabis legalization, has indicated that the government is exploring the commercial sales plan. With legalization already in effect, there is mounting pressure to expedite the process and address the absence of a commercial framework.
