While advocating for measures to ensure consumer awareness, particularly among youth, Gabel underscored the added challenges imposed by federal prohibition.

Evolving Perspectives on Legalization

The webinar hinted at a shifting stance within CADCA, with discussions signaling a pragmatic approach to potential legalization scenarios. While maintaining a focus on public health and safety, CADCA members explored methods to mitigate potential harms associated with cannabis reform without outright opposing all reform efforts.

Seeking Common Ground

Addressing the prospect of supporting federal legalization bills, Gabel emphasized the importance of unity in advancing prevention strategies, suggesting a collaborative approach to standardizing packaging and labeling requirements. While the specifics remain uncertain, there's a recognition of the need for collective action within the prevention community.

Leveraging Tax Revenue for Public Programs

CADCA highlighted examples of states utilizing tax revenue from legal cannabis sales to fund various programs, including youth prevention, education, and community reinvestment. By exploring alternative approaches to revenue allocation, states aim to address public health concerns and promote community well-being.

Evidence-Based Policy Considerations

Drawing from a 2021 study published by the American Medical Association (AMA), CADCA members discussed the impact of state-level marijuana legalization on cannabis-related arrests and racial disparities.

The findings underscored the importance of informed policy decisions and the potential benefits of regulatory reform.

Engaging in Policy Advocacy

CADCA's advocacy efforts extend beyond internal discussions, with calls for supporters to engage congressional representatives on pertinent legislative issues. By mobilizing grassroots support, CADCA seeks to influence policy outcomes and shape the regulatory landscape.
