

Connecticut Appoints First Cannabis Ombudsperson to Advocate for Medical Cannabis Patients

On Monday, Connecticut made regulatory history by appointing Erin Gorman Kirk as the nation's first cannabis ombudsperson. In this groundbreaking role, Kirk will serve as the state's official advocate for medical marijuana patients, working to ensure their needs and interests are prioritized within the evolving cannabis landscape.

Known for her extensive pro bono work, she has been a staunch advocate for social equity candidates in the cannabis industry, underscoring her deep commitment to the community.

Addressing Safety and Standards

Gorman Kirk's advocacy extends to concerns about product safety. She has firsthand experience with the potential risks posed by inadequately regulated cannabis products. After noticing adverse effects from using Connecticut-grown cannabis, she discovered issues related to mold contamination, highlighting the need for stringent safety and purity standards.

In response to these challenges, Gorman Kirk advocates for the development of industry-wide standards to protect consumers. She points to organizations like ASTM that are working towards creating such standards and expresses a desire to see uniform regulations implemented across states to ensure public safety.

Gorman Kirk notes that this shift has affected product availability and consistency, causing some patients to seek their medicine out of state. This situation raises legal and safety concerns, as well as potential revenue losses for Connecticut.

Gorman Kirk's appointment has been met with praise from patient advocates like Lou Rinaldi, who see her as a much-needed champion for medical cannabis patients. Her role as cannabis ombudsperson is expected to bring significant improvements to the medical marijuana program, ensuring that patient needs are met with greater attention and care.
